


Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2



Webster Groves Fire Station 2 was originally dedicated in 1954 as Engine house 3

Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2

- In its original design, Engine House 3 housed one pumper and three male firefighters.
- In 2001, Engine House 3 was remodeled and rededicated as Engine House 2.



Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2

- In its current configuration, Engine House 2 houses two pumpers and four firefighters.



Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2

- Engine house 2 has served the department well for almost 65 years.
- While the needs and mission of the Fire Department have changed, the building has not.
 - A lack of space for firefighters and equipment, outdated infrastructure and a lack of separation between personnel and contaminates necessitate its replacement.

Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2

- Parking at Engine House 2 is very limited.
- There are not enough parking spaces for everyone at shift change.
- Firefighters are forced to park on the street until someone leaves.




Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2



- A full size pick up truck will not fit in the provided spaces

- Vehicles must be moved to access trash dumpsters



Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2



- Common restroom and shower facilities lead to a lack of privacy.

Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2



- The open bunk room design leads to a lack of privacy and difficulty staffing multi gender crews

Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2

- An inadequate and dated HVAC system allows cold air into the bunkroom.
- This is a result of an uninsulated attic space that was used to house heating units.


- Apparatus must be strategically parked to allow doors to be opened.

Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2

- Due to a lack of personal space, firefighters retreat to the apparatus bay to read or study.



Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2

A lack of storage space leads to linens being stored in the apparatus bay.



- The small, residential style kitchen does not allow for second refrigerator.



- The second refrigerator is kept in the apparatus bay.

Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2



- Storage woes continue as food items, medical supplies and communication equipment must be stored together.

Webster Groves Fire Department Engine House 2

- The small residential style kitchen lacks necessary storage space and institutional style appliances that are necessary for a modern fire house.
- The kitchen is inadequate for four Firefighters to prepare meals.
- Firefighters are forced to eat in “shifts”

Apparatus must be “jockeyed” into position in order to fit both trucks in the Engine House.

In 2018 the Webster Groves Fire Department made **2970** Emergency responses.

Emergency Medical Service is the large majority of the Webster Groves Fire Departments call volume.

What does the Future Hold in Store for the Webster Groves Fire Department?

- In 2008 the WGFD made **1335** responses for Emergency Medical Services.
There were **207** request for an ambulance to respond from another agency.
- In 2018 the WGFD made **2068** responses for Emergency Medical Services.
There were **358** request for an ambulance to respond from another agency.

Emergency Medicine is a continually evolving and growing field. An aging population along with a greater scope of practice will eventually lead to the need for an additional ambulance.
